

SGT. JOHN OZIMKO

LONG BRANCH — Sgt. John Ozimko, Jr., 42, of 402 Second ave., died Dec. 2 at Fort Devens, Mass.

He was stationed with the 93d transportation company.

Sgt. Ozimko was born in New Britain, Conn., and was the son of Mrs. Anna Ozimko of Hartford, Conn., and the late John Ozimko.

He had been in the Army 23 years and had served in the North Africa, Sicily, and Central Europe campaigns as well as the Korean war. He was awarded the Silver Star, Bronze Star, Purple Heart with Oak Leaf Cluster, and Combat Infantryman's badge.
