7 NOV 1914 MARRIAGE to Gladys Gwendoline DAVIES

Albert was 4th son of Mr William H. Hastwell, Queen St, Norwood.
Minister was Rev W. Glen Clarke. The ceremony was held at Wellington Square Methodist Church 2.30 pm with a reception in the Lecture Hall. Best man was Mr Victor Buxton with his brother Mr Arthur Buxton groomsman. Albert & Gladys' home was in Brompton Park.

HOUSE NAME

Lyndell noted March 2012 that she recalled seeing at Gran Carlton's (Gladys Gwendoline formerly Hastwell (nee Davies) house in Thornbury Victoria a metal sign "Dungate" (this was among memorabilia on a desk) - she always thought it must be a town in England but the photograph of Albert's house in Brompton, SA, clearly shows this nameplate above the entrance. The name "Dungate" is definitely of some significance to the family as one of Albert's sisters, Lillian, bears it as her middle name; also the fact that Albert's widow took it with her to her new home in Victoria after she remarried.

ALBERT THE ARTIST

Albert was an amateur artist. Pearl recalled two sketches by him at 22 Collins Street Thornbury. One was of a wife and children waiting on the beach for a returning fisherman. She could not recall the other but it has since come into Wendy's safekeeping (from Kevin Carlton, Pearl's half-brother) and is a pencil sketch under glass, entitled "Impudent Hussies" and signed by Albert.

Adelaide, Wednesday, April 16(?)

(Before Mr S. Mitchell, SM)

Albert John HASTWELL, of Brompton, sued Dennis Naughton, of North Adelaide, for 19 guineas damages in respect to injuries sustained in an alleged assault while plaintiff was in his sulky. Mr F.G. Hicks appeared for the plaintiff and Mr C.J. Coventry for the defendant, who counter-claimed a similar amount for alleged

negligent driving, resulting in the plaintiff's vehicle striking him. Evidence was given for the prosecution by the plaintiff and Frederick W. Plate, and for the defence by Dr. Napier and the defendant. The plaintiff was awarded three pounds on the claim, and the counter claim was non-suited.

Daphne & Joy always said that "our father" was Albert Hastwell while they called their step-father Jess Carlton "dad".
