Robert William Clark(e) emigrated on the Orient Line's "Garonne" (which commenced sailing from London to Melbourne & Sydney 17 Apr 1878) from London, arrived 14 Sep 1878. In England he had worked in the carriage workshop for Midland Railway Co. First job in Adelaide was for Messrs Mellor Bros. Franklin Street.

(The 1885 SA Directory published by Sands & MacDougall listed Mellor Bros. as agricultural implement manufacturers, on the north side of Franklin Street, the last building before Morphett Street) After a few days he began working for railways in Adelaide on 20 Sep 1878. Then to Pt Wakefield workshops where he fitted up the first narrow gauge bogie carriage assembled in SA. On 25 Jul 1879 he began work for the SA Railways at Rivoli Bay in the South East.
